The naval stores industry and the production of turpentine in North Florida reflect a dark period in the history of the American South

The industry relied on convict leasing, debt peonage, and appauling working conditions for its mostly African American workforce

My research into this period of what could be described as post-slavery slavery provides the backdrop for an exhibition of sculptural works that I have been developing this year
