Send a Dozen to Get One Through: A Novel

- The purpose of this project is to explore, via fiction, the impact and lasting consequences of the Elian Gonzalez immigration saga on various communities (and on attitudes toward immigration as a whole) while also examining the effects of socioeconomic staus on first generation college students.
- Over the course of writing and revising the novel manuscript, the title was changed to Magic City Relic.
- Significant progress was made during the grant period: over 53,000 words were added between May 2012 and August 2012.
- Submission of the novel manuscript to publishers is expected to begin later this year.
