
Neighborhood Socioeconomic Typologies: A Comparison of Delinquency Prediction Models for Adolescents

 The results indicate statistically dependable profiles can be identified which provide more detailed information than person level risk factors alone, illustrating the necessity of considering macro-level criminogenic factors, endemic to geographically localized

subgroups.

This study represents the growing trend of practitioners to account for factors at higher levels of the model, but was still only an early step toward the ultimate goal of comprehensively and

accurately assessing

delinquency risk.

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
