## The Case of the Sexy Jewess: Dance, Gender and Jewish Joke-work in US Pop Culture

- Book documents rise & return of a curious figure of American Jewishness: The Sexy Jewess.
- Comic legacies of Jewish female stage and screen performers across 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> centuries help frame self-parody within a contemporary post-feminist, post-assimilationist period.
- Historical, ethnographic and choreographic methods ask how and why the Sexy Jewess proliferates among neoburlesque, alt porn, comedy tv, mainstream movies and magazine centerfolds to articulate today's Jewish woman through humor and gender rebellion.
- FYAP award helped complete and submit book proposal for manuscript, now under contract with Oxford University Press.
